From the President: Jeffrey Spiro, Ph.D.

I am from the Northeast where March has always been the harbinger of spring, that time of year when nature gives us a rebirth of its beauty and we, of course, did our annual spring cleaning. Of course, here in South Florida, we have nature sharing its beauty with us all year long, and at least here at the Summit, very few of us ever clean.

In order to compensate for this loss, let us use this time of year to give a rebirth to our future plans, and look at those good ideas with which we haven't yet dealt.

I would propose that we pursue three important endeavors.

1. Let us begin phase two of our interior renovations. I will schedule a meeting in April to discuss what we want done. People have been talking about lobby furniture, elevator lobby furniture and mirrors, new light fixtures, wider molding, ceiling tiles, paintings, fish tanks, plants, as well as many other ideas. We need to get together and make decisions.
2. Let us address the pool deck. We need to review what our options are as we deal with the pavers. At 9am on March 1st the Mirador eyesore removal started. Celebratory groups were watching from balconies on the north side of the north tower. Mayor Peter Bober took a turn at running the equipment and did surprisingly well. Thanks to the City of Hollywood for paying to remove this dangerous blemish on our neighborhood.

Project status

Rugs and walls: All done except for touch ups and 4th floor south rug. This last floor is waiting on the arrival of one last roll of rug.

Lobbies: Banisters and light fixtures and chandeliers are refinished and painted. We are still working on additional furniture.

Card rooms: Ordering new tables and chairs.

Alarm System: South tower and about 1/2 of the north tower is wired.

Still to do: Elevator floors, new benches in elevator lobbies, daytime outdoor bike rack, fob control for bike rooms, next outdoor beach bins, (and all that stuff in Jeff's article.) BTW: You can now reserve one of the new larger bins (w15"xh45"xd36") with a \$90 check in the office.

Cable TV and Internet – High-speed communications fiber has been connected from the street. The TV and internet entire system is being tested and fixed by OpticalTel. Just like all other major projects one may expect some inconveniences. In this case, we are experiencing some outages. See the article later in this Observer.

Don't Be an Island – Opt-in to New Our Telephone Directory

The office can no longer give out the old telephone directories. Changes in the law strictly limit what information can be included in new telephone directories. For example, unless you opt-in, your telephone number cannot be in the directory. Since we are only now setting up the process for opting-in, the only directory that the office can provide, at the moment, is fairly useless – only names and unit numbers. We are hoping the community will largely opt-in so that we can again have a way of reaching each other.

By mid-March the process for opting-in will be established. Notices will be posted around the Summit. Come to the office or check out MySummit.org at that point to get the form you will need.

Whether you opt-in or not, we still need your up-to-date contact information to the office. None of this information will be included in the directory or provided to others unless you choose to opt-in.

At a special evening event on February 13, Dr. Caryn Andrews, the daughter of Stan and Carol Scheinberg, newly arrived from Israel, shared her story of how and why she made Aliyah. Now living in Jerusalem she teaches Nursing at Hadassah University and is doing research at Hadassah Hospital in multicultural problems as they affect

attitudes and the giving of health care. Dr Andrews is a delightful, infectious speaker who captivated our attention and made us proud of the work Hadassah does in the medical research that affects us all. It seeks to heal the various ethnic and religious divisions in the Israeli population.

For our Thursday afternoon meeting, our guest speaker was Dr. Bernd Wollschlaeger of Miami, a specialist in addiction. His book, “A German Life”, dramatically tells his life story. He held our rapt attention with excerpts from the book, which tells of the tumultuous path he took to bring him to be whom and where he is today.

Now, with the arrival of March we are starting to think of Passover and Spring Cleaning. - Separate **Cardio & Weight Gyms** --3rd floor both towers, open 24 hours – please read & practice the gym etiquette rules -- men's bathroom/shower/sauna attached to cardio gym, women's bathroom/shower/sauna attached to weight gym
- **Shuffle board** -- SE corner of property, equipment at front desk, pick up team M/W/F 1:30-3:30,
- Two **Card rooms** in each tower (3rd floor) , internet hot spots (see signs for names & passwords)
